## **Dual Enrollment**

## For High School and Homeschool Students



College-ready high school and homeschool students with their school's approval earn **BOTH** credits that will be counted on their high school transcript **AND** credits for college courses that will appear on a Middlesex transcript at the same time. Students may take any Middlesex courses that they meet course prerequisites for (except classes in selective programs such as nursing).

Academic advising, tutoring, disability support, and library services are available to help students succeed. Dual Enrollment students are also eligible to participate in college sponsored activities and clubs.

## **Dual Enrollment Application Requirements and Admission Process**

- 1. **Meet** with your guidance counselor to discuss Dual Enrollment at Middlesex (MCC), confirm eligibility, and identify courses that meet high school graduation requirements and fit with your college plans.
- 2. **Attend** a **Dual Enrollment Information Session** with a parent or guardian. Register for a session at www.middlesex.mass.edu/dualenroll.
- 3. **Email** the date you and your parent/guardian attended the **Dual Enrollment Information Session**, with the materials requested below in **one email** to dualenrollment@middlesex.mass.edu.
- 4. Submit a completed Dual Enrollment Application form with all required signatures.
- 5. **Submit** a completed **English Multiple Measures** form demonstrating eligibility for ENG 101 English Composition I.
- 6. **Submit** a completed **Math Multiple Measures** form (if course prerequisites include math now or will include math in prerequisites for future Dual Enrollment courses).
- 7. **Meet** the 2.0 high school GPA requirement:
  - High school students submit their most recent transcript.
  - Homeschool students submit the homeschool approval letter from their school district.
- 8. **Submit** a **Dual Enrollment Registration Form** with specific course information. We will need signatures from you, your counselor, and a parent or guardian. Any registration changes require a new form.

Registering for future terms: You will be assigned an academic advisor in your first semester at MCC. To register for future courses, submit a Dual Enrollment Registration Form to your academic advisor. You cannot self-register. A 2.0 grade point average at Middlesex is required to continue taking classes.
